ICELAND'S SOUTH COAST

Explore Iceland's dramatic South Coast, where black-sand beaches, thundering waterfalls, lava fields, glacier lagoons, and towering icecaps create one of the country's most unforgettable landscapes. From the seaside village of Vík and the striking basalt formations of Reynisfjara to Jökulsárlón's floating icebergs, Diamond Beach, Skaftafell's natural beauty, and the powerful waterfalls of Seljalandsfoss and Skógafoss, this journey reveals the stunning contrasts of Iceland's famed land of fire and ice.

HOTEL VIK

Based in the country's southernmost village, Hótel Vík í Mýrdal has provided a warm welcome to visitors since 1994. The family-run hotel is remote and yet modern with its style being inspired by natural wonders.

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ITINERARY

Monday, January 18, 2027

Depart Reykjavik for the quaint village of Vik. After our Gunnuhver Hot Springs tour, we'll enjoy a group lunch on our scenic drive down the south coast. Upon arrival in Vik, check into the hotel and enjoy a night at leisure.

Tuesday, January 19, 2027

Today, breakfast is available at the hotel. We'll then depart for a full day of exploration as we cross Eldhraun, the largest mass of lava ever to flow on Earth, before reaching the small town of Kirkjubaejarklaustur, a former site of a 12th-century Catholic convent. Onwards to Skaftafell National Park, one of Iceland's most outstanding areas of natural beauty. We continue to the stunning Jokulsaron Glacial Lagoon to see floating icebergs and the Diamond Beach. Throughout the day, we are afforded magnificent views of the mighty Vatnajökull Glacier.

Wednesday, January 20, 2027

This morning, after breakfast, we'll check out of the hotel and enjoy an entire day exploring the wonders of the south coast. First, we'll visit Reynisfjara, a black-sand beach that is one of Iceland's most iconic natural attractions. This shoreline features black sands, formed from sea-worn black volcanic rocks. Also at the stop, you can see the bizarre and otherworldly basalt column wall. Solheimajokull is an outlet glacier of the much larger icecap of Myrdalsjokull. The vast grandeur of the area gives you a glimpse of the landscape-changing power these mighty glaciers have wielded over the years. Visit the majestic Seljalandsfoss and Skogafoss waterfalls, and the black-sand beaches along the South Coast, where the famous volcanoes are also located. Iceland's reputation as the "land of fire and ice" is well earned. Nowhere is this contrast more visible than on the country's south coast. Landscapes, geological features, and colors change from one moment to the next along this scenic route. We will also stop at the interactive Lava Centre to discover the natural forces that shaped the earth and began forming Iceland tens of millions of years ago. En route to Reykjavik, pass the charming village of Hveragerdi. This village is one of the few sites in the world located directly over a geothermal area. Because of its many greenhouses heated by hot water from nearby springs, it is often called the "flower village."
